Next he completed a two-year tour of duty with the army, during which he conducted the chapel choir at Fort Knox, Kentucky, and after that North Canton.

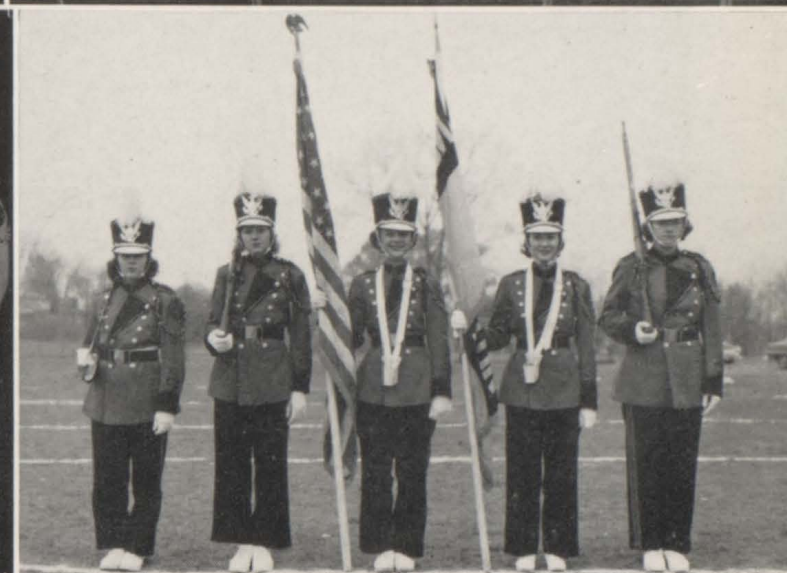

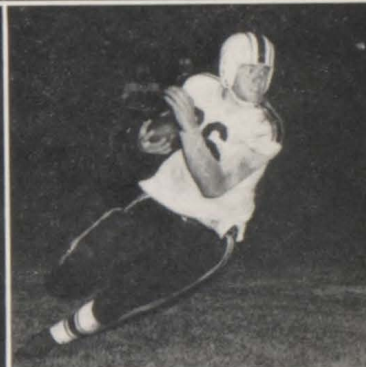
